## A PALACE IN A FEW WORDS

Legendary Palace overlooking the Promenade des Anglais in Nice, Le Negresco undeniably evokes "the art of French living." Facing the Mediterranean Sea, it is located 5 km from the international airport of Nice Côte d'Azur, and halfway between Cannes and Monte Carlo. This incredible Palace has recently been adorned with the modernity of the Third Millennium, in order to perpetuate its legend throughout the world.

Actors, politicians, writers, singers, artists and royalty, a number of whom have signed the *Livre d'or*, have enjoyed a holiday on the Riviera to live a little of the myth of Le Negresco. The myth is Jeanne Augier who is also the guardian. Hotel owner and CEO, this great lady - with strongly held beliefs - has devoted her life to preserving and enhancing this unique heritage. A visionary, she was able to meet the expectations of a demanding clientele in search of the exceptional.



## AN EXCEPTIONAL ART COLLECTION

Its strong identity, Le Negresco owes it in part to an important collection of works of art with over 6000 references. Thus one can admire the Yellow Nana of Niki de Saint Phalle in the Salon Royal. Its opulent forms highlighted by bright colors to represent to Jeanne Augier "the very image of joy and fun and the playful attitude." It fits perfectly with the series of seven highly colored modern carpets designed by Raymond Moretti.

Historical figures are also represented. The Salon Versailles welcomes the portrait of Louis XIV in historical costume such as can be seen at the Louvre and Versailles. This huge canvas signed by Hyacinthe Rigaud is one of the most beautiful pieces on display. And in this constant concern for preservation of these priceless pieces, two cabinet makers, graduates of the Ecole Boulle and an art restorer both ensure the perpetuity of the collection.

## ELEGANT AND BAROQUE ROOMS AND SUITES

The marriage of the antique and contemporary is the signature of the hotel. Five centuries of art and history form the soul of Le Negresco. Three emblematic suites allow you to measure the work and research needed to recreate a historical backdrop.

- The *Suite Imperiale*, decorated in the Empire style was inspired by the bedroom of Empress Josephine at Chateau de la Malmaison.

- The *Suite Pompadour* pays tribute to the favorite of King Louis XV with a chest of drawers of precious wood inlay and an antique walnut double bed "corbeille", finely carved and gold leafed.



- The *Suite Montserrat Caballé* houses, among other treasures, a Louis XV desk, two Sèvres lamps in porcelain and Louis XVI bed decorated with two gold-plated bronzes.

The interior of each of the 96 rooms and 21 suites has been inspired by the most outstanding periods of French art. The rooms are all equipped with exceptional and personalized authentic furniture and works of art dating from Louis XIII to the present. The latest technology has not been forgotten and each room is equipped with LCD televisions, wireless Internet access

### **RESTAURANT LE CHANTECLER**

Jean-Denis Rieubland, Chef of Le Negresco since 2007 (the year he won the trophy for "Best Craftsman in France") defines its cuisine and style as "inspired by the Provence, in respect to its products and traditions" and likes to pass his love of authenticity. It offers a majestic menu to the Michelin starred gourmet restaurant, Le Chantecler. Famous for its sumptuous decor of woodwork dating to 1751 and the cellar housing 15 000 bottles, the restaurant is one of the most sought-after dining spots in Nice.

## **LA ROTONDE BRASSERIE**
